Dear Valued Visitors.

We regret any inconvenience caused by the partial restriction of vehicular traffic at the port entrance during peak season. This measure has been implemented by the Construction Division of Takehara City. However, if you inform the security personnel at the port entrance of your intention to board the ship with your vehicle or your status as a local resident, access to the port will be granted.

As the availability of parking spaces varies with the arrival and departure of ships, we advise that you obtain up-to-date information on parking availability, vessel operations, and other relevant details from the port security personnel or terminal staff within the port facilities. In the unlikely event that the car park is full, you may turn right at the end of the street and exit to the national road without performing a U-turn.

During peak periods, the car park is frequently full in the morning, so we recommend that you arrive as early as possible. The free car park is open 24 hours a day, while the port terminal opens at 7:00 am daily, although it may open at 6:30 am during the busiest season.

For those intending to visit Rabbit Island in the afternoon, parking lots that were previously full in the morning are typically more spacious from 15:00 onwards. For day-trippers, the last boat leaves the port at 18:40, and the time spent on the island is around 20 minutes.

Moreover, rabbits appear to prefer dry pellets in the morning and moist vegetables in the afternoon. However, during the peak season, they are more likely to approach humans in the morning when they are relatively hungry. We, therefore, recommend visiting the island in the early hours of the morning. When interacting with rabbits, please observe the safety precautions outlined on the port website and the signs displayed on the island.
